

## SPORTS PREMIUM IMPACT STATEMENT 2015-16

### **Priorities for 2015-2016**

- 1) Increase participation in competitive sports - intra/inter school tournaments and competition.
- 2) Introduce new Rising Star Scheme of Work
- 3) Use outside coaches to support staff and have a positive impact on teaching and learning.
- 4) Increase participation in sports/competitions so school retains Sainsbury's Sports Mark award.

### **Increase Participation in Competitive Sports**

Membership to the sports partnership

Pupil participation in sporting activity remains high as a result of our membership of the sports partnership. Pupils continue to participate in sporting competitions and festivals in school and beyond. The Schools' Sports Partnership has developed its sustainability and remains a provision which greatly enhances high quality sporting opportunities for pupils. It also provides access to high quality facilities, equipment and professional expertise. It will continue to be a priority for funding.

In addition to above, various inter-class sports competitions are held every term. Over 100 year 5/6 pupils participated in lunch time competitive sports events. Furthermore, all children participate in school sports day, which includes team/individual competitive events. Children represent their 'Houses'.

Children at Hartley participate in a wide range of sport competitions. This enables them to demonstrate a high level of skill and understanding. Pupils' confidence in other areas of school life has increased. Sports has fostered team ethos and pride in our school, as well as positive relationship with other schools. Achievement is celebrated in weekly whole school assembly and winners receive medals/certificates.

#### **Competition for SEND pupils.**

We have continued to give opportunities for SEND pupils to participate in sporting competition. They have participated in competitions organised by school sport partner. Teachers have reported an increase in self-esteem and social skill in the children.

#### **Coaches to Support Teaching and Learning**

School has been working with coaches from our partner school and Middlesex Cricket's 'Chance to Shine' project. Working in partnership with coaches, staff are more confident using a range of teaching styles to provide high quality lessons. Pupils have also been given opportunities to participate in specialist sports such as archery and fencing.

#### **Introduction of Rising Star Scheme of Work**

New scheme of work was introduced in January 2016. As well as activities, the scheme focuses on physical education; enabling children to explain 'how and why' certain activities impact the body. Key theme of the scheme is to challenge all children by asking probing questions. Feedback from staff includes: *challenge for all children, especially more able, increase in oracy, more accurate assessment of progress on classroom monitor, access to online video clips.*

#### **Outdoor Education**

Year 6 children were provided the opportunity to improve agility, balance, co-ordination, team work and resilience. Working with Docklands Water Sports Centre, 100% of the children achieved Level 1 Royal Yacht Association certificate. Furthermore, 40 year 6 children participated in 'Outward bound' beginner course at the Lake District. In addition, 18 year 6 children achieved Level 1 and 2 Bikeability course.

#### **Increase Participation in Sports - Clubs**

Sports Premium funding has ensured that there is a wide range of activities on offer for children. Evidence of high levels of participation is available through club registers. There has been positive feedback from children and parents. Parents felt sport had a high priority in school and children were able to develop a range of different skills in the variety of clubs.

PE and Sport are celebrated across the life of the school. Our school has now achieved 'Silver' in the Sainsbury's School Games Kite mark.
