

PE and sport premium for primary schools

The government is spending over £450 million on improving physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools over the 4 academic years 2013 to 2014, 2014 to 2015, 2015 to 2016 and 2016 to 2017. The funding is being jointly provided by Departments for Education; health; and culture, Media and Sport and will be allocated directly to primary school head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all children in school.

Accountability

Since September 2013, Ofsted Inspectors will report on PE and sport provision and on how schools spend their additional funding. School will also be held accountable by requiring them to publish, on their websites, details of how they spend (or will spend) their PE and sport grant. They must also include detail about the impact this funding has on pupils' PE and sport participation and attainment.
