Safeguarding at Hartley Primary School

What is safeguarding?

Schools have a statutory responsibility to keep children safe from harm. The National Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children (NSPCC) defines safeguarding as:

- Protecting children from abuse and maltreatment
- Preventing harm to children's health or development
- Ensuring children grow up with the provision of safe and effective care
- Taking action to enable all children and young people to have the best outcomes

What does safeguarding look like at Hartley Primary School?

Safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children is **everyone's** responsibility. **Everyone** who comes into contact with children and their families and carers has a role to play in safeguarding children. At Hartley we take our responsibility to safeguard and promote the welfare of all children very seriously. Below are just some of the ways we do this:

- *We protect information about your child and only share it appropriately*
- *We respond appropriately to an unplanned absence, or to a pattern of poor attendance*
- *We track concerns about children confidentially*
- *We teach pupils about safeguarding issues such as online safety, keeping safe, anti-bullying and what they need to do if they have a concern or are worried about something*
- *We supervise pupils as they enter and leave the school building at the start and end of the day*

FAQs

Who should I speak to for more information, or if I have a safeguarding concern?

We recommend that your first point of contact are our Child Protection Leads: Ms Brobbey (Nursery - Year 1), Ms Kahlon (Year 2 - Year 4) and Ms York (Year 5 - Year 6) . The school's Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL) is Mrs Bhangra.

Who should my child speak to if he/she has a concern?

Your child can speak to any trusted adult in school. The adult will refer to the DSL if there is a concern about the safety of the child.
